### Great interest for the "Week of River Restoration"

The fourth national congress on river restoration held in Bologna from 22 to 26 October 2018 at the Third Tower of the Emilia-Romagna Region in Bologna ended with a large participation.

Organized by CIRF, Emilia-Romagna Region and Central Emilia Land Reclamation Consortium as part of the networking activities of the European project LIFE + RINASCE, the event was conceived as a real "river rehabilitation week" and was organized in various formative moments, workshops, thematic sessions and field trips.

#### Experimental management of vegetation: the results

At the end of the experimental activities carried out along some "pilot" sections, the final technical report is now available for consultation, which aims to assess the environmental, hydraulic and economic benefits of different "gentle" management methods of aquatic vegetation potentially applicable in the future. of the canals managed by the Reclamation Consortium.

On the other hand, the excessive development of aquatic vegetation along the canals can reduce their hydraulic functionality and lead to flooding in the event of intense meteoric events;



Therefore, the Consortium performs frequent maintenance operations on the vegetation (mowing or weeding) in order to prevent its proliferation and thus prevent flooding of the areas facing the canals. The report could therefore be the basis for future planning of the management activities of the Consortium channels to be included in the future redevelopment plan for the entire area.
